Caledonian Showing Championships - www.caledonianchampionships.webs.com

The Caledonian Showing Championships are now well established in the showing calendar and will once again give 2018 competitors the opportunity to compete at a top level Championship Final in Scotland. Evening Performances, loads of bling and razzmatazz everything an end of season Championship should have!

This year's show will be held at:

Highfield @ Howe, near Ladybank, Fife on 13/14 October 2018

This Show is a qualifier and every horse & pony placed 1st and 2nd in all Inhand, Ridden Showing classes (not fun classes) & Working Hunter/Pony classes will qualify to compete in any appropriate class at the Finals. Qualification will be from placings, no qualification cards will be awarded in the ring, and no qualification can go down the line. Qualification is for the Horse & Pony except for Adult/Young Handler classes, where the Handler qualifies. All qualified horses and ponies will be listed on the Caledonian Showing Show's website where you will also find a regularly updated list of qualifying shows as well as a wealth of other information.

RULES, REGULATIONS etc.

This show is run under BRC rules except as stated below:

- The Organisers reserve the right to (a) cancel any class (b) divide or amalgamate any class (c) alter the advertised times (d) refuse any entry without giving any reason.
- Officials **must** be obeyed at all times. Abuse of officials, including verbal abuse, will not be tolerated and may result in elimination/disqualification. Any abuse of a horse/pony, or misuse of spurs/whips etc may result in elimination/disqualification.
- It is the responsibility of all competitors to ensure they are in plenty of time for their class, the Organisers do not accept responsibility for competitors missing their class. Classes will **not** be announced on the tannoy.
- **HAT REGULATIONS.** Due to a change by the European Commission regarding EN1384 and BSEN1384 no longer being an accepted standard, all hats which only meet the standard EN1384 or BSEN1384, and do not comply with another standard from the above list, **WILL NOT** be accepted and therefore will not be permitted for any BRC competition. Hats which bear EN1384 or BSEN1384 along with another standard from the above list, will be tagged. For example, BSEN1384 & PAS015 (1998 or 2011) along with the Kitemark, would be acceptable, but not BSEN1384 on its own.
- The NERC committee **STRONGLY RECOMMEND** that hard hats are worn when showing in-hand also.
- Wherever possible, any horse/pony 2 years old or over should be in a bitted bridle.
- **AGES FOR RIDERS OF STALLIONS.** Riders must be 12 years old or over on 1st January in the current year to ride any pony stallion not exceeding 138cms or Small Breed M & M stallions ie Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland and Welsh Section A & B. Riders must be 14 years old or over on 1st January in the current year to ride any stallions exceeding 138cms or Large Breed M & M stallions ie Connemara, Dale, Fell, Highland, New Forest and Welsh Section C & D.
- Dogs must be kept under close control and on a lead at all times.
- **Please place your muck/litter in the bins provided or take it home with you, DO NOT muck out onto the car park.**

SECTION 1: RIDDEN HORSE CLASSES

(excluding pure bred M&M)

- Class 1 **NOVICE RIDDEN HORSE**, mare or gelding, four year old and over, exceeding 148cm (14.2hh). To be shown in snaffle bridles only. Horse/Rider combination not to have won any ridden showing class. Riders any age. **There will be no canter in the go round.** The judge will not ride.
- Class 2 **RIDING HORSE/HACK**, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. May be shown in snaffle bridle. Class will be judged on suitability of horse for its type, conformation, manners and condition. The judge **may** ride.
- Class 3 **RIDDEN HUNTER**, 4 years old or over, exceeding 148cm. May be shown in snaffle bridle. Class will be judged on suitability of horse for its type, conformation, manners and condition. The judge **may** ride.
- Class 4 **RIDDEN COB**, 4 years and over, exceeding 148cm. Open to both hogged and traditional/native types. The judge **may** ride.

RIDDEN HORSE CHAMPIONSHIP

open to 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 1-4

SECTION 2: COLOURED HORSES & PONIES

(OPEN TO SKEWBALD & PIEBALD HORSES/PONIES ONLY)

- Class 5 **IN HAND NON-NATIVE COLOURED HORSE/PONY**, skewbald/Piebald any height, age or sex, to be shown plaited and trimmed
- Class 6 **IN HAND NATIVE COLOURED HORSE/PONY**, skewbald/Piebald horses and ponies any height, age or sex, to be shown traditionally or hogged
- Class 7 **IN HAND COLOURED YOUNGSTOCK**, skewbald/Piebald horses and ponies. Colts, fillies or geldings born in 2017, 2016 or 2015. Class may be split into native and non-native youngstock.
- Class 8 **RIDDEN COLOURED HORSE/PONY**, skewbald/Piebald horse/pony 4 years old or over, any type, height or sex. Rider any age. The judge **may** ride. Class may be split into over 153cm and 153cm and under.

COLOURED HORSE/PONY CHAMPIONSHIP

open to 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 5-8

SECTION 3: RIDDEN PONY CLASSES

(excluding pure bred M&M)

THIS SECTION WILL NOT START BEFORE 11.30am.

- Class 9 **LEAD REIN PONY (plaited)**, mares or geldings, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 128cm. Riders not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Snaffle bridle only.
- Class 10 **FIRST PONY (plaited)**, mares or geldings, 4 years or older, not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 11th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Snaffle bridles only. No cantering is allowed except for individual performances, ponies must leave the ring in walk or trot.
- Class 11 **NOVICE RIDDEN PONY**, 4 years old or over, exceeding 128cm but not exceeding 148cm. Riders not to have attained their 17th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Must be shown in snaffle bridle. Competitors will be required to do a show. Class will be judged on suitability of horse for its type, conformation, manners and condition. Ponies will **not** be asked to canter on the go round.
- Class 12 **OPEN RIDDEN PONY**, 4 years old or over, exceeding 128cm but not exceeding 148cm. Riders not to have attained their 17th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Competitors will be required to do a show. Class will be judged on suitability of horse for its type, conformation, manners and condition. Ponies **will** be asked to canter on the go round.

RIDDEN PONY CHAMPIONSHIP

open to 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 9 to 12

SECTION 4: MISCELLANEOUS RIDDEN

THIS SECTION WILL NOT START BEFORE 12.30 pm.

- Class 13 **RIDING CLUB PONY 14.2hh AND UNDER**
Pony 4 years old or over, to be shown under saddle, to be ridden in a snaffle bit, no whip or spurs. May be required to do a small jump. Riders any age.
- Class 14 **RIDING CLUB HORSE OVER 14.2hh**
Horse 4 years old or over, to be shown under saddle, to be ridden in a snaffle bit, no whip or spurs. May be required to do a small jump.
- Class 15 **VETERAN HORSE/PONY**
Horse/pony 17 years or over to be shown under saddle. Riders any age. Riders of horses over 22 years should wear an armband and will not be required to canter.

MISCELLANEOUS CHAMPIONSHIP

open to the 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 13-15

SECTION 5: RIDDEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND

- Class 16 **LEAD REIN PONY (mountain & moorland type)**, mares or geldings, 4 years old or over, not exceeding 128cm. Riders not to have attained their 9th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Snaffle bridle only.
- Class 17 **FIRST PONY (mountain & moorland type)**, mares or geldings, 4 years or older, not exceeding 128cms. Riders not to have attained their 11th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Snaffle bridles only. No cantering is allowed except for individual performances, ponies must leave the ring in walk or trot.
- Class 18 **NOVICE RIDDEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND - ALL BREEDS**, stallion, mare or gelding, four years old or over, Pure-Bred Welsh C & D, New Forest, Fell, Dales, Connemara, Highland ponies, registered in their relevant Stud Book. To be shown in snaffle bridles only. Pony/Rider combination not to have won any ridden showing class. Ponies will not be asked to canter on the go round. **This class may be split by large/small breeds dependant on entries.**
- Class 19 **MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND RIDDEN SMALL BREEDS**, including Dartmoor, Exmoor, Shetland, Welsh A and B. Ponies 4 years old or over. Riders any age.
- Class 20 **MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND RIDDEN LARGE BREEDS**, including Highland, Connemara, Dales, Fells, Welsh C and D, New Forest. Ponies 4 years old or over. Riders any age.

RIDDEN MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND CHAMPIONSHIP

open to the 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 16-20

SECTION 6: IN-HAND MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND

SECTION 6 WILL COMMENCE at 10.30am in the outside arena.

- Class 21 **SMALL MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND IN-HAND** (including Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh A & B) Mares, geldings or stallions 4 years or over.
- Class 22 **SMALL MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND IN-HAND** (including Shetland, Dartmoor, Exmoor, Welsh A & B) Colts, fillies or geldings born in 2017, 2016 or 2015.
- Class 23 **LARGE MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND IN-HAND** (including Fell, Dale, New Forest, Connemara, Highland, Welsh C & D) Mares, geldings or stallions 4 years or over.
- Class 24 **LARGE MOUNTAIN & MOORLAND IN-HAND** (including Fell, Dale, New Forest, Connemara, Highland, Welsh C & D) Colts, fillies or geldings born in 2017, 2016 or 2015.

Classes 21-24 may be split (by age or breed) if there are sufficient entries

MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND IN-HAND CHAMPIONSHIP

open to the 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 21-24

SECTION 7: IN-HAND HORSES AND PONIES

- Class 25 **OPEN YOUNGSTOCK IN-HAND** (excluding pure-bred Mountain & Moorland) Colts, fillies or geldings born in 2017, 2016 or 2015. **Horses expected to mature at over 148cm.**
- Class 26 **OPEN YOUNGSTOCK IN-HAND** (excluding pure-bred Mountain & Moorland) Colts, fillies or geldings born in 2017, 2016 or 2015. **Ponies expected to mature at under 148cm.**
- Class 27 **OPEN HORSE IN-HAND** (excluding pure-bred Mountain & Moorland), mares, geldings or stallions over 4 years old, exceeding 148cm..
- Class 28 **OPEN PONY IN-HAND** (excluding pure-bred Mountain & Moorland), mares, geldings or stallions over 4 years old and not exceeding 148cm.
- Class 29 **VETERAN IN-HAND** Mares, geldings and stallions of any height and breed 17 years or over.

Classes 25-29 may be split (by age or height) if there are sufficient entries

open to the 1st & 2nd prize winners from classes 25-29

DIRECTIONS

Fountain Equestrian Centre is situated on the A947 Aberdeen to Oldmeldrum road, c.5 miles North of Aberdeen. Heading North on the A947, after the conurbation of Dyce. THE ROAD LAYOUT IN THE AREA IS EVER CHANGING DUE TO THE AWPR ROADWORKS; PLEASE ALLOW PLENTY TIME FOR YOUR JOURNEY. Fountain EC is on the left, about ½ mile North of this bridge.

HEALTH AND SAFETY POLICY
